In response to your correspondence dated September 1, 2023; the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) - International Events and Convention Services Program (IECSP) officially recognizes the following event:

Winnipeg Comiccon October 26 – 29, 2023 RBC Convention Centre Winnipeg, MB

The information provided to the CBSA states there will be approximately 40,000 attendees to which 2% are foreign to Canada and that the event is open to the general public with sales available at the event.

As outlined in your correspondence, this event is expecting approximately 10 foreign exhibitors who are importing display booths, comic books and collectibles for use at the event.

It should be noted that, non-Canadian exhibitors may import exhibit booths, display items, banners, and advertising materials temporarily as outlined in the provisions of tariff classification **9993.00.00.00** duty free, on the condition that the goods will be exported from Canada upon the completion of the event.

Goods imported for sale are not eligible under tariff No. 9993.00.00.00. These goods must be accounted for at time of release on a <u>Form B3</u>, *Canada Customs Coding Form*. Commercial release processing is fully explained in Customs Memorandum D17-1-5.

Goods imported as "giveaways" must be accounted for at time of release on a <u>Form B3</u>, *Canada Customs Coding Form* with all applicable duties and/or taxes collected at the time of importation.

Under certain circumstances, the CBSA will require a security deposit on goods temporarily imported to Canada. These goods are normally documented on the Temporary Admission Permit (Form E29B).

Under certain circumstances, the CBSA may waive the requirement for goods being temporarily imported to be documented on the Temporary Admission Permit (Form E29B) as well as the posting of a security deposit.



At the time of exportation, goods granted temporary admission on a Form E29B or Carnet must be presented along with importer's/owner's copies of the appropriate documentation to CBSA for verification and certification. This presentation may occur at a CBSA office inland or at the port of export, depending on the circumstances involved and is necessary for you to receive a refund of any securities posted. Please note that the refund is not immediate.

ConsultExpo Event Services Inc. has been designated as the official customs broker for this event. If you have any questions regarding importing meeting materials into Canada or if you wish to inquire as to the brokerage services provided, please contact Diane Labbé 514-709-0761.

CBSA requires everyone seeking admission into Canada to properly declare themselves to CBSA by providing accurate identification. CBSA will accept a valid passport as proof of citizenship.

Persons who have been convicted of any criminal offences may be inadmissible to Canada.
